Psalm 110:1-7

1. The one who has the answer

- 1) The Bible passage is a poem by David. His confession shows that he knew Christ with certainty and knew all that would happen in the future. It must have been a covenant to him and a profound answer. Psalm 110:1 "The LORD says to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies your footstool."
- 2) Psalm 110:2-3 "The LORD sends forth from Zion your mighty scepter. Rule in the midst of your enemies! Your people will offer themselves freely on the day of your power, in holy garments; from the womb of the morning, the dew of your youth will be yours."
- 3) David states in Psalm 110:4 that he knew who Melchizedek was. Only one person after Abraham, David, accurately identified the Melchizedek who appeared to Abraham in Genesis 14. The word Melchizedek only appears in the Old Testament in Genesis 14 and Psalm 110.
- 4) It's safe to say that Abraham and David were the only ones who knew and experienced Melchizedek accurately. David knew that the Lord had made him an eternal priest after the order of Melchizedek, not after the order of Aaron, and this is a marvelous thing. It's amazing to see the Lord seated at the right hand of the throne, but it's also amazing to know after the order of Melchizedek. Hebrews 7 explains this in more detail.
- 5) Psalm 110:5-6 "The Lord is at your right hand; he will shatter kings on the day of his wrath. He will execute judgment among the nations, filling them with corpses." They knew who Christ was, they knew that this Christ would come into the world, and they knew what would happen on the day of his judgment.
- 6) Although he lived 1,000 years before Jesus came, he had a very clear idea of Jesus: how he would judge the world in the day of his power and how he would rule the world from among his enemies by the rule of his power. Not only that, but he would have had a picture of the Lord seated at the right hand of the throne.
- 7) No one talks about Melchizedek after Abraham, but David, a man 1000 years after him, is saying something more fundamental than Abraham, who met Melchizedek in person. Abraham just saw Melchizedek and tithed to him, but David is telling the important secret of Christ.
- 8) It confesses that the Lord is a priest of God without foundation in the world who will be an eternal priest after the order of Melchizedek (Hebrews 7).
- 9) And Christ will he will shatter kings on the day of his wrath. He will execute judgment among the nations, filling them with corpses; he will shatter chiefs over the wide earth. It would be rather strange if you had a key revelation about the future, but it wasn't your overall life direction.
- 10) What kind of man was David with this answer, what kind of spiritual state did he have, and what kind of life did he lead? A man who was convinced that God's word was the answer to his future, and he had full conviction of it.
- 11) David is the author of half of the Psalms. He was a man of prayer and praise, and he had such a deep revelation of the covenant of Christ that he never lost a battle, and the nation of Israel became the greatest nation in David's time. Even unbelievers acknowledge him as the one who rescued them by killing Goliath as a boy. May you be blessed to go into the depths of the covenant.

2. Personalization

- 1) David had received a great revelation. That the Lord sits at the right hand of the throne, that his enemies are his footstool, that he is a priest after the order of Melchizedek, not Aaron, not a man, but a priest of God from heaven, was a revelatory realization from God. He will execute judgment among the nations, filling them with corpses, and that young men will come forth like the dew of the Lord's morning, all in a picturesque revelation.
- 2) And all of these words would have been a covenant imprinted on him, and therefore would have been the answer to his personal life and future, and would have been his standard of living.
- 3) This should take place in you as well and you do. You don't need revelation because you already have it. Jesus is the Christ. He is the solution to all problems, freedom from curses, every destiny is overturned, and the head of the serpent is crushed. You will naturally enjoy God 24/7, live with Him forever, receive answers to prayers, preach the gospel and you will have the kingdom of God upon you. All the spiritual problems will be resolved, and you will have victory and conquest.......
- 4) Everything has been given to you. All that remains is for all these promised revelations to become yours, and if they come into you and become yours, then you will be better than David. If David had the revelation that was to be, you have the revelation that has already been. You are enjoying this that has already been given, and you can confirm them as well.
- 5) Then, are you not better than David? Surely you are better. You are the one who has the promise that has been completed. You have received the fulfilled revelation as a covenant. All that remains is for all these promises to be yours.
- 6) Your spiritual work for this is important. May you hold to the covenant as you confess in prayer. May you be blessed as the time schedule comes upon you and your spiritual eyes open to this as you continue.
